Course Overview

Honors English 9 is a course that demonstrates a strong integration of rigor and Critical Thinking in the areas of reading, writing, listening and speaking. The course exhibits an in-depth study of writers and the content chosen for this course. The purpose of Honors English 9 is to challenge students and to further set a strong foundation in Reading and Language Arts in order to proficiently prepare them for the next level.

Major Course Objectives

- Students will read, analyze, and respond both verbally and in writing to selected literary works.
- Students will create representative pieces from literary genres.
- Students will utilize the writing process and produce narrative, expository, and persuasive papers.
- Students will increase and enhance their vocabulary base.
- Students will apply grammatical concepts in the editing/proof-reading process.
- Students will plan and present oral presentations using the Literature Circle model for learning.
- Students will understand the research process and avoid plagiarism.
- Students will understand the thesis statement and its function in multi-paragraph writing and essays.
- Students will possess the skills to prepare for unit tests as well as standardized tests.
- Students will analyze and critique topical readings, specific to nonfiction.
- Students will become proficient with available technology, specific to writing and presentations.
